Celeb Salons Presents Charles Curry and Kathy Bentz of the LGBT Coalition on Aging

Sunday, July 21, 4-6pm at Mort Subite, 308 Congress

Capital City Village is proud to present the continuation of our popular program series <u>Celeb Salons</u> - exclusive, up-close gatherings with some of Austin's local notables. Our next guests will be Charles Curry and Kathy Bentz, both

representatives from the Austin LGBT Coalition on Aging. You're invited to hear Charles and Kathy speak about their years of advocacy, the 50th anniversary of Stonewall, and what's on the horizon for aging and LGBTQ issues in Austin. Join us - all are welcome!

Kathy Bentz is a past co-chair of the LGBT Coalition on Aging. She retired from the State of Texas after 23 years in 2014, having worked for the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Early Childhood Intervention. She now works for a local nonprofit organization, NAMI Central Texas, an affiliate of the National Alliance on Mental Illness.

Charles Curry is retired following a career in Texas local government and several years with a private consulting firm as a senior consultant on performance management. He is currently serving as the chair of the LGBT Coalition on Aging, a board member of AustinUp and the housing and transportation work group on the City's Age-Friendly Plan. Charles is serving his second term on the City's LGBT Quality of Life Commission.

A recent AARP survey - Maintaining Dignity: Understanding and Responding to the Challenges Facing Older LGBT Americans (March 2018) - estimated more than 1 million LGBTQ seniors live in the U.S. and that number will likely double by 2030. Moreover, the survey found that their social networks more often include gay and straight friends (74 percent) rather than family (62 percent), and they are "significantly less likely to have kids and more likely to be single," reports Nii-Quartelai Quartey, an AARP senior advisor and national LGBT liaison. 




Coffee, Caffeine and Conversation Visits the "Mother Store"
