

### **Austin Has Returned to Stage 5**



- 1. Get the <u>COVID-19 vaccine</u>, if you haven't already. Vaccines are the best tool to protect us from COVID-19. They slow the transmission of the virus, and provide strong protection against severe illness and hospitalization.
- 2. Get the booster when you're fully eligible. Everyone 18 years and older should get a booster shot 2 months after their Johnson & Johnson vaccine, or 5 months after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna. Adolescents and teens ages 12 to 17 should also get a booster of Pfizer-BioNTech 5 months after their primary series.
- 3. <u>Continue wearing a mask</u> in indoor public places in areas of high or substantial community transmission. Use the <u>COVID-19 County</u> <u>Check Tool</u> to find your county's level of community transmission.

# CCV Member Nominated for Austin Music Industry Hall of Fame



#### It's Time to Order Your Mail-in Ballot

It is time to apply for your mail-in ballot. Even if you have received a mail-in ballot in previous years you must apply for your 2022 ballots. If you're 65 or older you qualify! When you download your application you want to mark the Annual Application. If you mark the Primary Election your application is only good for a single election. The last day to apply for the ballot by mail (received not postmarked) is Friday, February 18.
