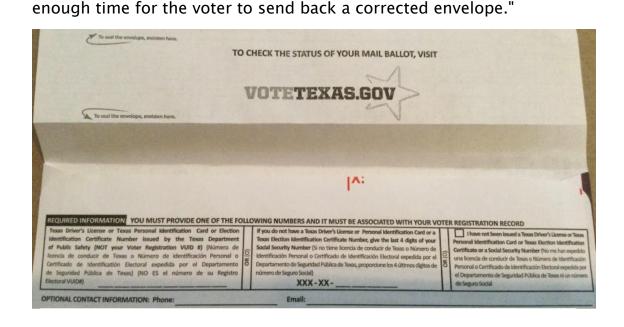

Scam Alert

Member and Volunteer Rick asked us to share this:

"If you get a call on your cellphone from 311 City of Austin saying that your electricity will be cut off in 30 minutes because your payment is behind, it's a scam. Call back the City at 311 and report it. The scammers will tell you that even if your records reflect payment there was a glitch in their software and you must do an online bank transfer of the balance due to avoid cutoff. They also say they will open a ticket to do an investigation into your account and you will be given a refund if their investigation shows you have already paid."
