
From Board Member Lori Forgay

Medicare Fraud Prevention Week is June 5-11

The most effective way to stop Medicare fraud from occurring is to prevent it from happening in the first place. Learning how to prevent it and then sharing what you learn with others is how the whole community can participate in this week!

Start the week by learning how to read your Medicare statements! Read your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN) or Explanation of Benefits (EOB) in the paper form that is mailed to you or go online to Medicare.gov and review claims digitally.

Remember these three steps:

- **Prevent:** Learn how to read your MSN by watching this video, <u>How to Read</u> <u>Your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN)</u>.
- **Detect:** When reviewing your MSN or EOB, look for services, products, or equipment you didn't receive, double charges, or items your doctor didn't order. Call your doctor or insurance company if you have questions.
- **Report:** Call 1 (800) MEDICARE to report fraud.
