Facts Everyone Should Know About Advance Planning and the Five Wishes

Join CCV members, volunteers and friends for an informative session that we can all use - "Facts Everyone Should Know About Advance Planning and The Five Wishes". The program is Sunday, April 28 from 2:00-3:30pm at the AGE Building, 3710 Cedar Street, in the St. David's Room. There is on-street parking and the building is accessible.

The program will feature Barbara Epstein, Attorney specializing in elder law, and Kathy Wohlert, PhD. A Q&A session will be included.

Barbara will address the following questions:

- Do you really need a will in Texas?
- Some basic facts about Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid
- How not to get scammed
- What legal information can you trust on the internet?
- When do you really qualify for a nursing home?
- What does Adult Protective Services do?

Kathy says:

"Ninety percent of people say that talking with their loved ones about end-of-life care is important. Twenty-seven percent have actually done so. Eighty-two percent of people say it's important to put their wishes about end-of-life care in writing. Twenty-three percent have actually done it.

Isn't it time to begin the conversation and make your wishes known? 'Five Wishes' is a document created by Aging with Dignity that is a gift to your family, your healthcare providers and, most of all, to you. It expresses in simple language your wishes in areas that matter most - not just the medical and legal, but especially the personal and spiritual."

Kathy will also discuss Small Estate Affidavits, which are alternatives to wills for those with limited incomes and property.

Light refreshments and handouts will be provided. Advance RSVP required.






Celeb Salons Returns with Danny Britt
