

Can You Tell Which of These Two "Mindfulness Meetings" Was More Successful?



Which meeting was more successful? From a mindfulness perspective, it all depends on what "story" we tell ourselves and how our culture influences our "made-up story" which always seems, of course, "true and obvious" because it's "our" story :)

Our Managing Mindfulness meetings are all about calming our "judging mind," our "inner critic," our "restless mind" that's constantly coming up with "what-if's" and "if-only's" - and, instead, allowing ourselves just to see and experience what is right in front of us - without judging it - without making up a "story" about it.

Which meeting was more successful? There is much about our culture that would say the answer is obvious! Others would say there is no way to know, and that each person attending will have had a very individualistic experience that might have seemed profound or mundane - or, maybe that person simply had an opportunity to observe and enjoy and be present with others - all of us wanting to be more present to what life offers.


Fiber Arts Gallery on WEST Austin Studio Tour


