## Is it Rude to Ask Friends if They're Vaccinated?

Is it appropriate to ask the friends we'll be gathering with, as well as hosts and acquaintances, whether they've been vaccinated? Nationally syndicated etiquette columnist Thomas P. Farley, also known as Mister Manners, calls the matter — a potentially delicate, offensive one — "a fair topic."

"I don't see any impoliteness about it whatsoever," he says. "In a way, it would be almost unusual — especially if it's someone you haven't seen in a while whom you consider a friend — to not ask them.
