We are privileged to hear from retired McCombs School of Business Marketing Professor Dr. Eli Cox Sunday, June 2 from 3-5pm at a member home. He will be talking on <u>"The Life and Times of Adam Smith"</u> who lived from 1723 to 1790. There will be refreshments, a presentation by Dr. Cox and opportunities for questions and conversations. <u>Please RSVP</u> so the hosts will know how many to prepare for. We will send the program address to all who <u>RSVP</u>.

Adam Smith (1723-1790) was a Scottish economist, philosopher and author as well as a moral philosopher, a pioneer of political economy and a key figure during the Scottish Enlightenment, also known as "The Father of Economics" or "The Father of Capitalism".

"It is not from the benevolence of the butcher, the brewer, or the baker that we expect our dinner, but from their regard to their own interest." ~ Adam Smith

Smith laid the foundations of classical free market economic theory. His book *The Wealth of Nations* – considered his magnum opus and the first modern work of economics – was a precursor to the modern academic discipline of economics. In this and other works, he developed the concept of division of labor and expounded upon how rational self-interest and competition can lead to economic prosperity. Smith was controversial in his own day and his theories remain debated in current times. (Source: <u>Wikipedia</u>, May 30, 2019)

<u>More about Dr. Eli Cox</u>: Dr. Cox served as Director of the Option II MBA Program from 1982 to 1985 and Department Chairman from 1985 to 1989. He also served as the Director of the Business Honors Program. His research appears in journals such as the Journal of Marketing, Journal of Marketing Research, Public Opinion Quarterly, and the Journal of Product Liability, and the Journal of Public Policy and Marketing.
